

Many of you are aware that Frank Samuelson, ALPHA's President for the last several years, was injured in a fall at his cabin here in Lilac Park last September.

Shortly after his fall, Frank underwent surgery to repair a broken hip and is currently in a rehab facility in Concord. Frank's recovery has been slowgoing over the last seven months, with some improvements and some setbacks.

Last summer, your Board of Directors decided to utilize some of the association's reserve funds to update the pool's solar system, including the structure on top of the roof house where it sits.

Because the late winter last year forced roof renovations into August, the board decided to wait until this year to complete the installation of the new panels.

The board plans to complete the installation this May so that the pool is warm on the planned opening day of June first.

A home is robbed every 14.6 seconds and the average dollar loss per burglary is \$2,119, according to statistics just released by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. And that's the good news because burglaries were down slightly in 2010 compared to 2009. Sure you lock your doors and windows when you're not home. You'd be surprised how many people don't.



Fire Danger on the Rise



Let's prevent this in Lilac Park.

Even with the late storms we've had recently, this has been one of the driest winters on record. The fire danger is likely to be VERY high this year and we can look forward to a dry summer that comes with a significant threat of wild fire in our community.

Please take the appropriate steps to protect your property and community by removing dead or dying timber (whether standing or not), clearing your lot(s) appropriately of needles, slash, and other potentially flammable debris. There are a number of trees in Lilac Park infected with the Bark Beetle and these should be removed to reduce fire loading and to prevent spreading these pests to healthy trees.

See CalFire Guidelines for appropriate clearances and other things you can do to protect your property. Start early, doing a little bit over a longer period of time helps make it an easier task. If you are unable to do this yourself, consider hiring a lot clearing service. Preliminary CalFire inspections have already begun.

The ALPHA Social Events Committee Kicks Off in June!


In years past, the ALPHA board hosted a monthly get-together at the pool over the summer ending with the Annual Association Meeting in September. Well, we want to bring this tradition back.

Did you know ...

Arnold is named after Bob and Bernice Arnold, who, in 1927 opened the Ebbetts Pass Inn. Prior to that, the community consisted of two large ranches where logging was the main industry.

The inn served as a stop for people traveling along the Ebbetts Pass route as well as lodging for those visiting nearby Calaveras Big Trees State Park. In 1928, Camp Wolfeboro was established nearby as a Boy Scout camp and continues to be in operation today. The first post office was opened in 1934.

Water Conservation is Important

The lack of significant rainfall and snow in the Sierras this winter will have an impact on water storage that comes from the many lakes, streams, and rivers in our area.

Proper water conservation practices are crucial to preventing heavy restrictions on use of water and most are relatively simple and inexpensive to put into use around your Lilac Park home. Here are just a few tips to help conserve:

- When washing dishes by hand, don't let the water run while rinsing. Fill one sink with wash water and the other with rinse water.
- Run your clothes washer and dishwasher only when they are full. You can save up to 1,000 gallons a month.
- If your shower fills a one-gallon bucket in less than 20 seconds, replace the showerhead with a water-efficient model.
- Collect the water you use for rinsing fruits and vegetables, then reuse it to water houseplants.
- Shorten your shower by a minute or two and you'll save up to 150 gallons per month
- Grab a wrench and fix that leaky faucet. It's simple, inexpensive, and you can save 140 gallons a week.
